Burmese: The Burmese was created in the United States in the 1930s from the breeding of a male Siamese and a brown female cat found on the San Francisco waterfront, believed to have traveled there from Burma. The Burmese cat is even-tempered and displays a sleek and glossy coat of solid sable brown, blue, champagne or platinum. It loves warm laps and enjoys cuddling up in bed, either under the covers or on top of its favorite people. [More >>](#)

Chartreux: The Chartreux dates back to 16th-century France. Its thick, velvety coat is any shade of blue-gray, from ash to slate, with the tips lightly brushed with silver. The Chartreux and its copper or gold eyes hint at its relation to the Russian Blue, whose eyes are a deep emerald green. The highly energetic Chartreux breed is always up for a game of fetch and is highly inventive in subtly training its owners. [More >>](#)

Chausie: The Chausie combines the genial nature of a domestic cat with the beauty and elegance of a jungle cat. This big, muscular breed has large, mobile, tufted ears, long legs and a naturally short tail reaching to the hock. These breedings were performed with the intent of enriching the color varieties and patterns in the Siamese.
