

California Spay/Neuter Bill in Limbo

AB 1634 could be brought up for another vote.

California Assembly Bill 1634 can be brought up for another vote this week. A bill that would require the sterilization of cats and dogs was considered Friday by the California State Senate and was granted "reconsideration."

California Assembly Bill 1634, formerly known as the California Healthy Pets Act and now cited as the California Responsible Pet Ownership Act, can be brought up for another vote next week as it stands.

The bill, authored by Assemblyman Lloyd Levine (D-Van Nuys), must be voted on before Aug. 31 to stay alive. Amendments to the measure most recently added microchip rules, and require only cats and dogs who are repeat offenders to animal control ordinances to be sterilized.
